A few reminders from the Dockmaster

Dock lines are looking good. Thanks people!

Check your Hurricane plan:

- Correct phone numbers (yours and your buddy's)
- Equipment is located and correctly documented on the plan
- Engine runs, and dock lines can be untied
- If you are going out of town between now and the end of hurricane season, confirm your boat buddy is available during that time.
- You can then send the updated plan to the Dockmaster <u>bscdockmaster@gmail.com</u>

If we make the call to leave the docks, commit time for your boat, and also to help with club supplies and equipment like BBQ Grills, garbage cans, dock boxes, carts, bikes, etc...


It is no small task to prepare a boat: remove canvas, bimini, dodger, sails, etc. and then anchor it with proper technique.

Allow plenty of time, keeping in mind it might be hot, raining or both.

Finally, be prepared to help others and assist shoreside, too.

The marina is, for all intents and purposes, full. Vacant slips have blank yellow boards on them. Rates for slips are posted under the clubhouse. We are generating a new waiting list. One needs to be a member who actually owns the boat in order to request a slip for it.

Finally, the end of A dock is not to be used unless one is onboard the whole time the boat is there. B dock slips need the space for coming and going to their slips, and your boat may have to move at a moment's notice. C dock allows for 2 or 3 tie-ups. Contact the Dockmaster for overnight use.

Drifter to Deluge: Ensigns, San Juans &

Despite several days of rain and possible tropical storm in the forecast, it certainly didn't look that way at first on September 27. The first race of the Ensign Fall Series was postponed for nearly an hour in hot, humid and sometimes sunny conditions. There was enough air to drift around the Signal Boat *Piccolo*, but no gust above 2.8. Three Ensigns were out, along with Mark Weinheimer in his San Juan 21.

Joining us was a new class: Portsmouth (more on Portsmouth below).

Seven boats altogether started the race when the wind filled in some, and the start was competitive. Ensign *Red Stripe* (McCrocklin/Eckenroth, etc.) led *Blue Note* (Hittner/Brennesholtz) narrowly for the first two legs. Then *Blue Note* tacked away into a header and lost a lot more ground. Blake Sohn in *Long Shot* was third but made up ground on the spinnaker leg. The race was shortened at the windward mark just as serious rain and wind came up the Neuse. It was an exciting ride back to sheltered water in limited visibility and very heavy rain.

Portsmouth Class

The Portsmouth Yardstick handicapping system is an empirical, data based time-on-time method of equalizing boats. It is not a "golf" handicap or a collective opinion rating like PHRF. Many inland lake

sailors use Portsmouth. It takes into account wind speed, since some boats are designed to perform better in light air, and some are better in heavy wind. It also compares actual results to "Benchmark" boats which are rated the same nationwide.

The Portsmouth fleet September 27th consisted of a Hobie 16, a MC Scow and a Flying Scot. I haven't seen the results yet, but I hope we get more Portsmouth and San Juan boats out on a prettier day.






